GE Edison Award Winner and Award of Excellence Winner

Congratulations to the team of Frank A. Florentine, William Jacobs and David M. Heck of the National Air and Space Museum, Smithsonian Institution, for winning the 2004 GE Edison Award for lighting the James S. McDonnell Space Hangar in Chantilly, Virginia.

The James S. McDonnell Space Hangar at the Steven F. Udvar-Hazy Center features 113 large space artifacts - including the Shuttle *Enterprise* and an instrument ring from a Saturn V rocket - and more than 500 smaller artifacts. Says lighting designer Frank Florentine, "The scale of the project was overwhelming. It was like lighting players in a sports stadium, except the players weren't moving.
